QUAD COUNTY CORN PROCESSORS AND COBANK DONATE  
TO AREA FIRE DEPARTMENTS AND GALVA ECONOMIC

Quad County Corn Processors, a 35 million gallon ethanol production facility in Galva, Iowa, and CoBank, a \$107 billion cooperative bank, recently donated matching funds to three area fire departments and the Galva Economic Development Corporation. As part of CoBank's Renewal of "Sharing Success" for 2015 program, a total of \$10,000 was donated to the non-profit entities in August for projects.

CoBank's "Sharing Success" program has become one of the cornerstones of their charitable contribution giving programs.
